After the surprise choice of a gospel from John last Sunday, every gospel reading for the Sundays of Ordinary Time will now come from Luke. Today we are re-introduced to one of the key players (if that's the right term) in the Lucan narrative. The Holy Spirit was a prominent agent in the infancy stories, appears now as the driving force of Jesus' mission, and is always intimately involved when Luke deals with prayer.

In his agenda-setting exhortation, *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis wrote of the need to invoke the Spirit constantly, even if it means "being plunged into the deep and not knowing what we will find." He went on: "Yet there is no greater freedom than that of allowing oneself to be guided by the Holy Spirit, renouncing the attempt to plan and control everything to the last detail, and instead letting him enlighten, guide and direct us, leading us wherever he wills" (#280). Luke's Jesus did exactly that .

SUNDAY 23 JANUARY 2022
WORD OF GOD

The Sunday of the Word is celebrated on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time after Christmas. The Sunday of the Word of God was instituted by Pope Francis on Sept 30, 2019.

"The Word that saves does not go looking for well-preserved, clean, safe places. It comes into our complexities, into our darkness. Today, as then, God desires to visit those places where we think He doesn't go." (POPE FRANCIS)

Pope Francis' goal was to create a day to remind Catholics of the importance of knowing Scripture, and for its inaugural celebration, he gave bibles to several of the participants. The Sunday of the Word of God seeks to highlight the presence of the Lord in the life of men and women. God really walks with us and is present through the Word, as expressed in the logo of the Sunday of the Word of God, inspired by the biblical story of the Disciples of Emmaus who, while on their way, revisit the Scriptures with the Lord, allowing themselves to be taught and enlightened.



- 24 January **St Francis de Sales** (Born in Savoy [France] in 1567. Died in Lyons in 1622. As a presbyter and as bishop of Geneva, he played a major part in the renewal of 17th century French Catholicism. Seen by many as an early proponent of ecumenical dialogue. Founded the Visitation order with Saint Jane Francis de Chantal [12 December]. His writings promoted a spirituality for laypeople. Remembered as a most influential preacher, writer, and spiritual director, who combined firmness with patience and gentleness.) **Source: Liturgy Brisbane**
- 25 January **The Conversion of Saint Paul** (This date, first linked with the conversion of Saint Paul in the so-called Martyrdom of Jerome [c.431], became established in the liturgy of Gaul. Celebrates the work of God's grace at a major turning point in the life of Paul himself and in the history of the infant Church.) **Source: Liturgy Brisbane**
- 25 January Promulgation of Second Vatican Council by Pope John XXIII in 1959
- 26 January Survival Day (for some) and Australia Day (for others) (This is the date of the arrival in 1788 of the first European settlers in Australia. The liturgy marks Australia's national day with prayers seeking God's blessing on all its peoples, old and new. The liturgy prays for harmony and respect among all Australians and commends the nation and its leaders to God's care.) **Source: Liturgy Brisbane**

MESSAGE FROM TONY FARLEY (EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SYDNEY CATHOLIC SCHOOLS)

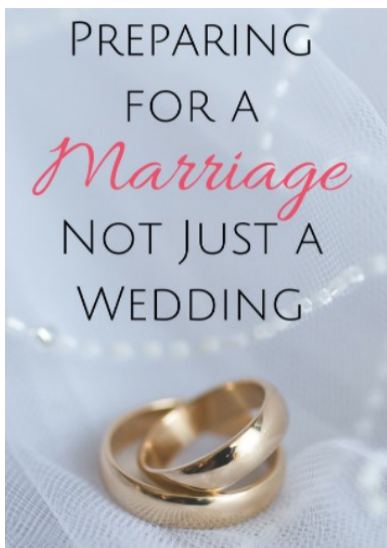
