There's a wonderful verse about wisdom in the book of Proverbs. Describing her role in creation, she says: "I was beside the master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence" (Prov 8:30, RNJB). That phrase, "ever at play in his presence," is itself delightful. It also sheds light on what we do at liturgy. We are at play in God's presence, as liturgical pioneer Romano Guardini wrote in his celebrated book of 1918, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*.

The word of God certainly invites us to the play of our imaginations. Today's reading from that most visionary work, the *Apocalypse/Revelation*, stretches our minds more than once. It features a Lamb who is a shepherd, and blood that washes robes white. These seemingly self-contradictory combinations tease us to discover new insights. They save us from a narrow mindset that reduces truth and beauty to the merely factual and leaves no room for the play of grace.

Christian believers thrive in a world of fruitful tensions: the divine and the human, the "now" and the "not yet," life and death, shame and glory, to name but a few. We flourish when we are "at play in his presence."

Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life

John 6:63, 68

Today's readings are all about having faith in God and trusting that God will be there. In the Gospel, Peter says, 'Lord, to whom shall we go?' and in the reading from Acts, he travels around bringing hope with simple acts. In many of the readings about Peter, he could be accused of overthinking things, tying himself in knots because he is unable to understand what Jesus means and he wants instant or easy answers. How refreshing it is to see that Peter can place his trust so simply in Jesus. We can all overthink our faith at times, especially when we don't understand. We try to find a complex explanation, when we need to get back to basics. We may not always understand, but let's remember belief does not rest on understanding, it rests on faith.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

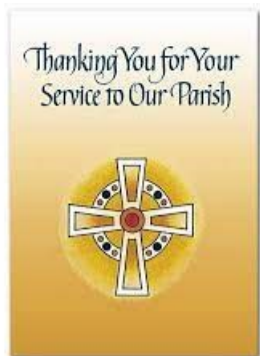

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

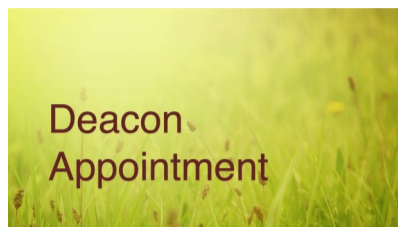

SUPPORT FOR THE HOUSE OF WELCOME

The House of Welcome works with people seeking asylum and refugees to provide critical casework, housing, employment, food bank and emergency living assistance. During COVID-19 the demand for financial assistance has risen. HoW has increased the Emergency Living Package program by 216% to respond to the amplified levels of distress and hardship amongst their clients. In the last few months House of Welcome has delivered emergency assistance and been able to support clients to maintain their tenancies and assisted those who have come to the centre homeless. There are a number of ways that you can help such as donating to the Emergency Relief Package or donate staple food items to the House of Welcome foodbank (see attached [flyer](#) for items needed).

10 May **Mother's Day**

(Many Australians follow the Mother's Day traditions that stem from observances in countries such as the United States and the United Kingdom. The Mother's Day date in Australia is the same as the date observed in the United States, which is the second Sunday of May each year. However, it is an Australian who is credited with having started the tradition of giving gifts on Mother's Day: Janet Heyden, a resident of Leichhardt Sydney, started a campaign in 1924 to collect gifts for lonely aged mothers.
