Responsorial Psalm: Happy the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Be watchful and ready: you know when the Son of Man is coming! Alleluia!



“Sell your possessions and give alms. . . For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” Luke reports Jesus’ blunt bidding without qualification. Of the three synoptic evangelists, Luke issues the clearest warnings about the dangers of wealth. One might wonder what prompted him to be uniquely sensitive about the issue.

In his snapshots of the early Jerusalem community, he stresses how they sold their goods and shared the proceeds among themselves so that no-one was left in need (Acts 2:45, 4:34). These idealised portraits contrast sharply with the melodrama of Ananias and Sapphira who each dropped dead when accused of defrauding the community. No wonder, as Luke observes, “This made a profound impression on the whole Church and on all who heard it” (5:11)!

In his encyclical on human fellowship, Fratelli tutti, Pope Francis writes of “the common destination of created goods.” He quotes John Chrysostom – “Not to share our wealth with the poor is to rob them and take away their livelihood. The riches we possess are not our own, but theirs as well” – and Gregory the Great – “When we provide the needy with their basic needs, we are giving them what belongs to them, not to us” (#119). These words from long ago have not lost their punch.

## MARY MACKILLOP FEAST DAY CELEBRATIONS 2022

Mary MacKillop Place and the Sisters of Saint Joseph extend a warm invitation to celebrate the Feast Day of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop on Monday, 8 August 2022.

“After two years of disruption due to COVID, we look forward to welcoming pilgrims and supporters to Mary MacKillop Place in North Sydney,” says Sr Monica Cavanagh, Congregational Leader of the Sisters of Saint Joseph.

“Mary MacKillop Place is a site unlike any other because Mary lived, died and is buried here.”

Visitors will have the opportunity to visit the Mary MacKillop Memorial Chapel, attend Mass, pray at St Mary’s tomb, and visit the Mary MacKillop Museum. Feast Day details are:

- **Where:** Mary MacKillop Place
- **Pedestrian and Wheelchair access:** 80 William Street, North Sydney
- **Wheelchair access:** Via the Museum Gates, 7 Mount Street, North Sydney
- **Mass times:** 8:00am, 10:00am and 1:00pm

**Chapel opening time:** 9:00am to 3:30pm (The Chapel will be open for private prayer and visits to Mary MacKillop’s tomb)

**Museum opening time:** 9:00am to 3:30pm (On Feast Day, Mary MacKillop Place offers free admission to the Museum so that pilgrims may explore the story of Mary MacKillop and the foundation of the Sisters of Saint Joseph)

8 August

Feast of Saint Mary (of the Cross) MacKillop (Mary MacKillop was born in Melbourne [Australia] in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. REMEMBERED for her eagerness to discover God’s will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in for God’s providence. She was named Australia’s second patron in 2013).

10 August

St Lawrence (Died at Rome on this day in 258, four days after Saint Sixtus II [7 August], with whom he was closely associated. Honoured for his almsgiving. Became, after the apostles, the most celebrated martyr of the Church of Rome. His cult spread throughout the Church from the fourth century. REMEMBERED in Eucharistic Prayer 1 [The Roman Canon], and in five ancient Roman churches dedicated to him).

11 August

St Clare (Born at Assisi (Italy) in 1193 or 1194. Died there on this day in 1253. From a well-to-do family, Clare embraced an evangelical way of life after hearing the preaching of Saint Francis of Assisi (4 October). Founded the order of the Poor Ladies, now the Poor Clares. REMEMBERED for her life of extreme poverty, austerity, contemplation, and charity).
